Program Eligibility

Mentees:

- Should be members of NRPA and/or their state association.
- Must be willing to commit time to the Mentorship Program.
- Must be employed (or actively seeking employment) or be a student in the parks and recreation field.
- Should participate in their local or state parks and recreation association.
- Must complete and submit the online Mentee Application.
- Not limited to entry level professionals

Program Eligibility

Mentors:

- ▶ Should be members of AAPRA, NRPA or their state association.
- Must be willing to commit time to the Mentorship Program.
- Must have significant experience in the parks and recreation field.
- Must complete and submit the online Mentor Application.

Mentee/Mentor Matching

- Mentees provide information on size/type of their current organization, current position, future career goals, etc.
- Areas of expertise/experience desired from mentor, e.g. financial management, programming, park operations, etc.
- Preference for a mentor within their state?
- Preference for size/type of organization of mentor?
- Matches are made based on information provided
- Up to mentee to reach out to mentor to make first connection
- Very few instances when matches don't work out
